

- 1. Many adolescents regard mass media as major source of sex knowledge because they are easily accessible. The faulty views about sex advocated by mass media exaggerate the excitement of sex and deliberately avoid mentioning the responsibility and consequences of sex. If adolescents accept these faulty views without careful consideration, they will have wrong interpretation of sex.
- 2. Faulty views about sex advocated by a lot of media include:
 - \odot The more you reveal your body, the more attractive you are
 - \odot Sex is an instinct that needs immediate gratification
 - **○** Dating must involve sexual activity
 - \odot Sex is a resource that can be traded
- 3. In a society flooded with pornographic information, adolescents need to learn how to reject faulty views about sex in order to protect themselves. The following are the methods:

 - Think twice before you act
 - Refuse to "sell your body for money" or engage in compensated dating

 - Respect people's privacy and consider other people's feelings by thinking from their perspective
 - Join the fight against "pornography"
